

Blessed Mary, a disciple in prayer

We began the 40 days of Lent on Ash Wednesday reading from St. Matthew's Gospel. There in the Sermon on the Mount Our Lord said to his disciples, "... when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." Jesus prays in this way frequently, rising very early before dawn to seek out a deserted place to pray. In this he teaches his disciples throughout the ages an essential way of prayer.

But in his humanity who would have taught Our Lord this way of prayer? Our Blessed Mother is the model of a disciple in prayer and our mother who teaches prayer.

Pope Benedict XVI has written, "The stages of Mary's path, from the house of Nazareth via the Cross, where her Son entrusted her to the Apostle John, to the house in Jerusalem, are marked by the capacity to preserve an atmosphere of persevering recollection in order to meditate on each event in the silence of her heart, before God (cf. Lk 2: 19-51), and, in meditation before God, also to understand the will of God and to become capable of accepting it interiorly."

In life we have anxiety about what the future holds; we can be uncertain as to the course that we should take and what might happen on the way. And even in the lesser decisions of ordinary day-to-day life we wonder just what to say or to do as events unfold in our lives.

Our Blessed Mother gives us the example of preserving an atmosphere of *persevering recollection* beginning in the house in Nazareth in her desire to do God's will: how to reconcile her desire to be a virgin totally dedicated to God and at the same time to be a mother. She waits in the inner room, not taking matters into her own hands, but listening to God. And then the angel Gabriel.

Mary accepted what the angel said, but she also asked for a little more light, just enough to take the next step. She didn't need to know everything in advance. "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" In our lives we can often ask how will we do this? How do we fulfill our vocations?

We too keep all these things, reflecting on them in our hearts.

There are many deserted places to pray as the inner room of our heart is the center of our being in our homes, in our cars, in crowded streets, and in quiet chapels and churches; we pray always in the inner room of the heart.

As the 40 days unfold let's pray, asking for a little more light, just enough to take the next step on the Way.

Mary, mother of grace, mother of mercy, in life, in death, protect us, Our Lady.
