

Change your life (and of others!) in 1 minute per day

Our theme this Lent is prayer. Many of us may think prayer is "basic" or monotonous. And while most of us may know how to recite the "Our Father" and the "Hail Mary" or other prayers, the key for a deeper relationship with God and growth in our soul is sustaining a constant connection with God. If you're already praying daily, great! But if you're only reciting prayers once a week at Mass then I invite you to make a conscious decision this Lent to start your day in prayer.

Prayer changes us and it changes our lives. How we start out our day can make all the difference in the trajectory of our day. I know we are all busy. Most of us get up and move at the speed of light to get our kids and ourselves ready for where everyone needs to be. This Lent, I invite you to set your alarm five minutes earlier than usual, and use that time to offer a short prayer called The Morning Offering before starting your day. In this prayer, as the name suggests, we offer up everything in our day--our prayers, works, joys, and sufferings--to the Lord for ourselves, our relatives, our friends, and the intentions of our Holy Father. This 1-minute prayer focuses our attention on surrender and doing everything with love.

God is calling each of us to go deeper and to live a life different from the secular world around us. This prayer has changed how I go about my day. It reminds me to choose love in my daily activities. For example, the other day, I ran an errand to the supermarket and a kind woman asked me



if I spoke Spanish to which I responded, "A little". She then asked me to help her ask the manager for a job application. What I thought would take just a minute turned into a much longer time. I helped her fill out the application and translated for her during an impromptu interview. Although, it required more time than I had thought, I knew that I had been called in that moment to help this woman. And God knew that I was going to be there that day. After finishing my time with her, I said a prayer to the Lord asking Him to help her get that job. As a result of my morning prayer, I was ready, with an open heart to help someone, and my sacrifice of time was a prayer answered for that sweet woman.

Below is a copy of the **Morning Offering Prayer** so you can cut it out and put it somewhere visible as reminder to offer your day to God. It's also available in the Hallow App, which is how I recite it every morning. If you're looking for some powerful resources this Lent and in your faith journey, the Hallow app is an amazing resource for Catholics. There are rosaries led by people like Mark Wahlberg, Jonathan Roumie, and Father Mike Schmitz; short, daily gospel reflections, devotionals, music, true miracle stories, daily saint reflections and much more.

I pray you will choose to do something more this Lent to keep the flame of faith burning within.

On the first Easter Sunday, Jesus appears to two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus as they depart disappointed from Jerusalem. After the disciples, who can't recognize him, wonder how he hadn't heard about the things that had happened in Jerusalem, Jesus astonishes them with his question, "what sort of things?" In doing so, Jesus listens to their disappointment. He hears them. And he hears us in our own disappointments, our own concerns, and our own hurts. But he doesn't leave them on the road to find meaning for themselves. Instead, he walks with them, and he walks with us, because he is close to us. Sure, we are journeying now through Lent for the annual celebration of this event in the Resurrection at Easter. But during this time of Lent, we have a more intentional time to walk and talk with Jesus. We invite you to join Father Will Tarraza as we reflect on God's closeness: in the Eucharist, in prayer, and in Reconciliation. Let us prepare our hearts to be burning with love for Christ now and forever.



Fr Will Tarraza, OFM Cap. is a Capuchin Franciscan friar living in Jamaica Plain. He was born and raised in Cape Elizabeth, Maine and has a wonderful family with whom he remains close. He currently serves his Province of Capuchins as the director of Post Novitiate formation, assisting young friars in their journey to make a life long commitment to be a Capuchin.
