

THE TEMPTATION OF JESUS

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. Mark 1:12-13 SUNDAY OF LENT Mary, the mother of Jesus, is our mother, as well. As Jesus died on the cross, he gave his mother to be our mother when he entrusted her to the care of St John the apostle. As all of our prayers ascend to the Father through Jesus, so it is said that all of our prayers go to Jesus through Mary. She is our mother and our intercessor. As a mother cares for her children, so she cares for us, each of us, individually.

It is hard to imagine how much a mother can suffer when her children are in distress. Most mothers would rather go through the agony themselves than see their child suffer. But Mary was forced to watch as her son was tortured and put to death by crucifixion, a most humiliating and painful way to die. In the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary, we meditate with Mary on the sufferings of her son, Jesus. She was with him in spirit during his agony in Gethsemane as he foresaw the sufferings and torture he was to undergo. His painful scourging, his humiliating crowning with thorns, the carrying of his cross to Calvary, and his painful and demeaning crucifixion were all accepted by him as the will of the Father, the only thing that mattered. But Mary also suffered that "sword through her heart" that Simeon had predicted when Christ was presented in the temple not long after his birth. I'm sure that she felt all his humiliation and pain as he was rejected by the bystanders and crucified as a criminal.

But Mary, like Jesus, accepted that suffering because she knew that it was the will of the Father. When the angel Gabriel announced to her that she would be the mother of the Messiah, she assented: "Let it be done unto me according to your word." This included the acceptance of all of this suffering.

As we enter the season of Lent, let us remember that we, and our loved ones, are bound to suffer in our lives. It may be small compared to others or it may be great, but it will be ours. The saying "offer it up" has been overused and become somewhat trite in our age. It is often ignored by those to whom it is addressed because it has become so common and, seemingly, without meaning. But it has great significance!

To realize that you can offer all of your sufferings, small or great, to the Lord as a means of aligning yourself with his will can help us overcome despair and bring hope into distressing situations. To know that what we suffer is the will of God, to know that his will is only for good and that we can give all of our sufferings to the Father, just as Jesus and Mary did, can be not only consoling, but even a source of great joy and hope.

We have just entered the season of Lent, a season of penance. Penance is a virtue by which sinners are disposed to hatred of their sin as an offense against God and to a firm purpose of amendment and satisfaction. What better way to do penance for our sins than to unite ourselves with Mary who was conceived without sin. As we follow her example in always doing the Lord's will, we will come to recognize and hate our sins. She is our mother, and she will guide and teach us as a mother guides and teaches her beloved child.

To deny ourselves of unnecessary things in order to learn self-discipline and to do good works to help others are things that a good mother trains her children to do by her example. Let us follow the example of Mary, always doing the Lord's will and always loving her children, not just Jesus, but all of us. She will show us the way to imitate him and his love, the way to the Father and to life in the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, Pray for us sinners, Now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Mary, make our Lent holy and fruitful by helping us to follow your example in striving to do the Lord's will in everything and at all times.






FIRST READING

Genesis 9: 8-15




