

We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true interior conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were baptized into Christ's death, died to sin, and began new life in Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR

MAKING A CHOICE

I was a pretty active person in my younger days. Participation in youth sports was followed by a military career that required being in physical condition. Ice hockey, soccer, wrestling, skiing and "working out" at a gym were all very routine in my life at one time or another. So it is not uncommon for me to be admonished by a family member or friend to join a team of some type or exercise more: "You should....[FILL IN THE BLANK]." To which I invariably reply, "What, are you kid-ding? That takes a commitment. Maybe someday when life is simpler."

So I am well aware of how difficult it can be to change our routine or even add an event that is not in our routine. That's why we try to figure out the most optimal time for the most people to attend our Lenten offerings such as Stations of the Cross, the Collaborative Penance Service, or Holy Week liturgies. This is, also, the case with our year round schedule such as the times for Mass or weekly Adoration. Nevertheless, we can't meet everyone's optimal time. The schedule of someone who works is different from someone who is retired, and both are different from a family running their kids around to their youth activities.

Lent is a perfect time to make such a commitment on behalf of our spiritual life and, more importantly, for our relationship with the Lord. It could be as simple as making a choice to bring the family to Stations of the Cross and the Lenten meal that follows on just *one* upcoming Friday. Or to stop in at Adoration *one* Wednesday evening driving home from work. A small choice in favor of a closer relationship to the Lord would not only benefit an individual or a family, but also our parishes.



This is a free event with no need to RSVP. Claire will be available to sign and sell copies of her book immediately after the presentation.







FIRST READING

Ex 3: 1-8a, 13-15

Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush, "Moses! Moses!" He answered, "Here I am." God said, "Come no nearer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers," he continued, "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. But the LORD said, "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering. Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey."


