

On this third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we find that nothing is ordinary with God. When we strive to sanctify the everyday ordinary moments of our lives we will find that even the ordinary can be quite sublime.

The prophet Jonah helped "the great city of Nineveh" to realize this truth. Jonah was assigned by God to convert the city and turn the people from "their wickedness." Fearing the task, Jonah fled in the opposite direction, as far away as he could to the coast of Spain. However, even though you, or I, or Jonah may neglect our duty, eventually God's will prevails.

Thus, a giant storm arose putting the ship and its occupants in danger. Jonah admitted that the storm was his fault, and willingly offered to be thrown overboard. The sailors had mercy on Jonah and tried to regain land, but the storm was too much and they threw Jonah overboard.

Now it was time for God's mercy. "The Lord sent a large fish, that swallowed Jonah; and he remained in the belly of the fish three days....then the Lord commanded the fish to spew Jonah upon the shore," whereupon he was given new life. Jonah took advantage of his second chance, and converted the entire city, as the people fasted, prayed, and put on sackcloth.

It would be nice if the story ended here, but we find that Jonah grew angry that God relented of his punishment and showed mercy. In discontent, Jonah left the city, built a hut and waited to see what would happen. God provided a gourd plant, "giving shade that relieved him of any discomfort." Then God sent a worm that destroyed the plant, and a scorching heat that caused discomfort. Jonah responded, "I have reason to be angry, angry enough to die."

How blind and selfish is Jonah? He laments the personal loss of a shady plant without any concern over the threat of loss of life to the Ninevites. If God in His goodness provides a plant for Jonah without any effort or merit, how much more is He willing to show mercy to all people when they repent of their sins and seek pardon!

If you are not aware of it already, Monday, January 22, 2024 marks the 51st anniversary of the infamous Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision. Last year, the Supreme Court returned the decision of life or death for the unborn to the states. Therefore, much work is still needed to change hearts, educate, witness, and open minds to the sacredness of all human life. The annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. was held this last Friday with this year's theme, "With every woman, for every child."

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta went to "Nineveh." She went to the United Nations and spoke boldly to the most powerful people in the world about the dignity of ALL human life. She said, "Works of love begin at home and works of love are works of peace. We all want peace, and yet, and yet we are frightened of nuclears, we are frightened of this new disease. But we are not afraid to kill an innocent child, that little unborn child, who has been created for that same purpose: to love God and to love you and me. This is what is such a contradiction, and today I feel that abortion has become the greatest destroyer of peace."

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta sanctified every moment of her life, from the slums to corporate meetings. She saw the dignity of each human being, the preborn and those at the end stages of life, the sinner and the saint.

May we strive through our everyday, ordinary lives to joyfully follow our common call to work for the respect for all human life. Let's support the various pregnancy care centers and maternity houses. Let's intensify our prayer and courageously give witness to the mercy of God. As to the people of Galilee, Jesus also says to you and I, "This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel."







FIRST READING




