# MAR 17, 2024

Our Lenten Reflections have focused our attention on Our Lady. The Blessed Virgin Mary is also the topic of Father Colarusso's Thursday classes. Why spend so much time talking about this woman from Nazareth? The first reason is Mary's unique role in Salvation History. Her *fiat* opens the door of the world to the Savior. Christ is the dawn, and Mary is the Morning Star, who signals his arrival. She doesn't just herald Christ's coming like John the Baptist. She is the one through whom and by whom Christ enters the world. She's the doorway of salvation, the Mother of the Living, the New Eve.

The second reason is what our Blessed Mother means to discipleship. Mary is the icon of discipleship. Anyone who follows Christ, follows him only insofar as they imitate her, consciously or not. And anyone who entrusts themselves to Our Lady can be assured of becoming a disciple of Christ since Mary's discipleship in every way leads to Jesus her Son. It is no exaggeration to say that in Mary, discipleship has no room for improvement.

Our faith is all about relationships between persons. First and foremost, our relationship with the person of Jesus. Second, our relationships with the persons with whom we live. We can discern some elements of Mary's relationship with God in Luke's account of the Annunciation, the moment when the Angel Gabriel visited Mary to ask her to be the Mother of the Savior. First, Mary is a virgin. Her virginity is a sign of her consecration to God; it's total. Even in her body, she is God's (Psalm 84:2). Second, Mary is receptive to the creativity of God. Just as the waters of the abyss welcomed the creative action of the Holy Spirit in the beginning (Gen1:1-2), so also Mary welcomes the creative work of the Holy Spirit in the conception of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity (Lk 1:34-38). The difference between Mary (whose name in Latin means sea) and the abyss of water is freedom. Mary freely welcomes God's initiative. Finally, Mary's faith is unwavering. God asks us to believe in what appear to be very difficult and even unbelievable things for those who do not have the eyes of faith: the One God is Triune, God's Son became man, God's Son suffered and died for us, following God means we will suffer persecution, and the Kingdom of Heaven has come just to name a few. While Mary lived these mysteries in the Fullness of Time in Nazareth, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem, she always assented without hesitation or complaint, pondering them in her heart (Lk 2:51).

Mary's faith, which characterizes her relationship with God, informs her human relationships. She always acts in faith. By faith, she travels to her cousin Elizabeth's home to help prepare for the birth of her son John the Baptist. By faith, she waits on God to reveal himself to Joseph, her future husband, and so be welcomed into his home. By faith, she accompanies her Son with the love of a Mother and a Disciple, as her vocation takes her to Bethlehem, Egypt, Nazareth, Jerusalem, and eventually to the foot of the Cross. For us bad news, a failure, a disagreement, or tragedies can lead us to doubt God's faithfulness. In these dark moments, Mary leaned into her faith in God and surrendered herself to his care. Imagine how she felt when she learned Joseph planned to end their engagement and "put her away" (Mt 1:19). Imagine how she felt when she learned they would have to travel 90 miles to Bethlehem with her due date looming (Lk 2:1-5). Imagine how she felt when she saw her Son hanging on the cross (Jn 19). In all of these circumstances, she renewed her faith and it grew until it could house the entire Church. "Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold your mother." (John 19:27).

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
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
