

The summation of the 10 Commandments is to love God and love our neighbor as taught and demonstrated by Jesus.

The autobiography off St. Therese of Lisieux - "The Story of a Soul," was one of the most beloved books of the 20th century. I think one of the reasons why she was able to love God and neighbor as she did in the "little way," doing ordinary things with extraordinary love, was because she was raised in a very devout family. Her parents are saints themselves and her four sisters all religious sisters.

St. Jose Maria also grew up in a very devout family. He founded Opus Dei which "consists in spiritually helping all people, from all backgrounds and professions, to sanctify the everyday ordinary moments of life. Truly understanding our Divine Filiation makes us willing and able to love God and all our brothers and sisters.

Lesser known Boris Kastell learned after many years to love God and neighbor. He was born in Zagreb, Croatia, to an aristocratic family. He attended the best schools, learned seven languages and earned a doctorate in chemistry. He was an academic hero.

He competed in the 1936 Olympics in Berlin where he saw Hitler leave the stadium after the African-American Jesse Owens won the gold medal. Boris went up to Jesse and congratulated him for his victory. Boris also competed in the winter Olympics that year in cross-country skiing. He was an athletic hero.

In World War II, he joined the underground and fought against the Nazis. He was tireless and brave as he risked his life to turn back the tide of evil unleashed by Hitler. Boris was an atheist who one day found himself hiding out in a Catholic monastery. Huddled in a monk's robe, he sat in the Church, which had no other light but a paschal candle. He found himself strangely moved by the light and began to question himself. Is Jesus really what his followers say he is? Is he a savior? Is he worthy of love? The answer would come later. He was a war hero.

After the war, Boris felt such a bitter hatred for the Nazis that he joined a secret group of Nazi hunters who roamed South America looking for them and turning them in to the authorities. One day he met a Jewish family who gave him a package to bring back to New York and give to their daughter. Her name was Eva and she ran a dance studio.

Boris brought the gift to the studio. When he saw Eva, a "Jewish Princess," he fell in love with her - and she with him. They began seeing each other during the few months he had in the city before returning to South America. Friends urged him to allow Eva to teach him to dance in her studio so that they could dance together. But he somehow understood that were he to do this he would lose the hatred he held tightly in his heart. He did not want to let it go.

The day came for him to leave. He was at the airport, tormented at losing Eva yet committed to what he deemed was a just cause. As he debated with himself, he recalled the lighted candle from the monastery. He uttered his first prayer, "Jesus take away the hatred in my heart. Fill it with love." Repeating the prayer over and over, he felt the hatred draining from his being. He left the airport, took a taxi back to the studio and went in. Eva was there. He went up to her and bowed in his courtly, European manner and said, "Shall we dance?"

They married and grew in love year by year. Soon thereafter, Boris and Eva entered the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) and became Catholics. They spent the remainder of their active days teaching religion and English in a Catholic high school. This miracle of love between a man and woman is an image of the mystery of love for God to which we are all called. Boris became a hero of love for God - as did Eva.

In the Last Judgement sermon in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches that it is ethical, moral and good to feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, clothe the naked, and help our neighbor in all ways. But this must be done in the way that St. Teresa of Calcutta gave. As if she were giving to Christ Himself.

May the disciples of this holy season help each and every one of us to know that, "the law of the Lord is perfect...they are more precious than gold, than a heap of purest gold; sweeter also than syrup or honey from the comb."

Truly love God and love ALL our brothers and sisters.



His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.


