

DIRECTOR OF PARISH LIFE

Pope Benedict XVI wrote in his encyclical *God is Love*, that "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." (no. 1) Nothing illustrates this more than the story of the early church detailed in the Book of Acts. The Book begins with the Ascension of Jesus (40 days after his Resurrection) in which he again promises the Holy Spirit. Shortly thereafter, we learn that the early church–under the direction of Peter–chooses a new Apostle, Matthias, to take Judas' place. Then we find that Jesus' disciples remain in Jerusalem, in obedience to Our Lord's final command. Also in obedience to Our Lord, they engage in a nine-day-period of intense prayer as they await the outpouring of the promised Holy Spirit. This event changes them; it changes everything. They are filled with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and power from on High. They are made new just as we have been made new.

We must look at this story with fresh eyes. There is no evidence that the Apostles knew that the Spirit would show up in nine days. In fact, they did not know when or how he would make himself known. We can imagine, with all that had taken place over the previous forty days, how much their trust must have been tested. We human beings–especially nowadays–hate to wait. The small community of believers might have been tempted to think that they were wasting time, that they weren't doing anything productive. They had the memory of Jesus and the remarkable things they had seen and heard since they had been called; they had each other; and they had the promise of the now Ascended Lord. I sometimes wonder if everyone remained in that upper room. I wonder if I would have stayed. Would I have been impatient with the Lord and left by day four or five and missed out on this gift of the Holy Spirit? How long can God ask someone to wait for him? God is never late. He always shows up at exactly the right moment.

The Power which the Apostles received serves a purpose, then and now: to witness to the fact of Jesus' Resurrection (Acts 1:22) and his saving power. The Apostles knew their mission, but they certainly did not know from day-to-day what God would accomplish or who he would put in their path. The stakes for them were also, dare I say, much higher than they are for us today. For example, today's first reading depicts the Apostles' arrest and bold proclamation of the Gospel to the Sanhedrin, the very group of men who had put Jesus to death a few weeks earlier. I do not have any such threat to my life today (though many, many Christians throughout the world do). Do I hide my faith because I'm afraid—not of losing my life—but of losing some opinion of my family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, or even a stranger? How can I proclaim Christ when I'm nervous to make the sign of the cross in public or pray for God's blessing on my meal at a restaurant or in the cafeteria at work or school? Do I limit the power of the Holy Spirit when I give in to that fear?

The lessons offered to us in the Book of Acts are not history lessons, at least not primarily. They are a powerful testimony to the work of the Holy Spirit—the Spirit of Christ—who works in the church today. He is at work in the sacraments, the Scriptures, and the hearts and minds of all believers. He is given to us for the sake of our mission. We too must be convinced of our mission and boldly proclaim Christ in word and deed. We must trust that Christ has indeed anointed us for our mission to family, friends, co-workers, and people we have not yet met. And we must dedicate ourselves to prayer so that we can "activate" that power, that grace of God in our daily lives.

FIRST READING


Acts 5: 27-32, 40b-41

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them. So they left the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name.

GOSPEL

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?"
