

ST. LUCY CHURCH | 254 MERRIMACK ST.



The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults



In the spring of 1997 a note appeared in the St. Monica Parish bulletin that Msgr. Richard Little, our pastor of blessed memory, was going to form a catechetical team to begin welcoming new members into the Catholic Church through a process of education, faith sharing, and rituals known as *The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)*. The *RCIA* process would follow the ancient practice of the Church; it had been restored by the Second Vatican Council as the normal way adults prepare for baptism. *RCIA* also began at St. Lucy Parish.

For nearly thirty years in our parishes *catechumens*, those who are not baptized, and *candidiates*, Catholic adults who have been baptized but uncatechized, or those baptized in a Protestant Christian church community have entered into the *RCIA* process. This liturgical year our parishes have one catechumen and six candidates.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults has gone through a revision process and with the beginning of the new liturgical year in Advent is now *The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)*. The Latin text from which the English is translated has always been titled *Ordo initiationis christianæ adultorum*. In the new translation, using the English word *order* more strictly adheres to the Latin. It is more properly an order as it is not a single rite, but a series of rites based on the principle that the process of conversion proceeds gradually, in stages. The rites have also been faithfully translated from the beautiful Latin text into beautiful English.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults consists of four periods of formation which are marked by rituals that celebrate what has been completed and that call a person into the next phase.

On the First Sunday of Advent we celebrated the *Rite for Entrance into the Catechumenate and of Welcoming the Candidates*. With the coming of the 40 days of Lent our catechumen and candidates begin a period of intense prayer and spiritual preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation. On the First Sunday of Lent we will celebrate the *Rite of Sending the Catechumens*. Our catechumen will then travel to Holy Cross Cathedral to celebrate the *Rite of Election of Catechumens* with Archbishop Richard Henning and the other catechumens in the Archdiocese of Boston who will enter into the Church at the Easter Vigil. In addition, we will celebrate the *Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion* in our parishes.

Since *The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* process takes place within a parish community, the prayers from our community are essential for the journey. In addition, the prayers of the universal Church are with each candidate, providing spiritual support for the journey and connection to the Church community. Please keep our catechumen and our candidates in your prayers.





He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted -and you yourself a sword will pierce- so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.
