

"About eight days after he said this, he took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" [Luke 9:28ff]. The account of the Transfiguration of Jesus marks the beginning of the end of Jesus' public ministry on earth. This event closely follows Simon's identification of Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of the living God, and Jesus' subsequent vocation to Simon as Peter, the Rock on whom Jesus builds His Church [Mt 16]. Note that the Gospel of Luke specifies the conversation with Moses and Elijah, a conversation regarding the events that would take place in Jerusalem.

Jesus descends from one mountain top experience and sets His face to the next mountain top experience. Of course, these events are ultimately for our benefit: Peter, James, and John experience the Transfiguration so they can strengthen the faith of their brothers [the Apostles, the disciples, and even us!] after Jesus' second transfiguration on Calvary. He was transfigured into a worm, hardly human! [Ps. 22].

Today, the Church guides us through this transfiguration in our celebration of Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. In this one Holy Mass, we anticipate the events of the coming Holy Week. While first century historians do record the death by crucifixion of the man named Jesus of Nazareth, we believe through faith not only that Jesus died but that He also rose from the dead and appeared in His glorified flesh.

Superficially, we could say Lent is done as we have remembered His death today. The next celebration of Sunday worship is Easter Sunday. Yet, we journey with Our Lord and God, Jesus Christ, and that journey is our hope. The solemn events of Holy Week guide us in a more detailed way in our walk in the Lord's Way. Holy week will culminate not at the Mass of the Lord's Supper nor at the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. "Even when I walk through a dark valley, I fear no harm for you are at my side" [Ps 23]. Jesus places His trust in the Father's will. That trust is vindicated, that darkness is pierced, as surely as the side of Our Lord as He slept in death on the Cross. The culmination of this Holy Week is the gateway to Easter Time, the Light of Christ's Resurrection that pierces the darkness of death to give us the hope of new life, new and Eternal Life. That Light dawns in the light of the Easter Fire that begins



DIVINE MERCY

Through St. Faustina, the Merciful Savior has given the aching world new channels for the outpouring of His grace. These new channels include the *Image of The Divine Mercy*, the *Feast of Mercy* (Divine Mercy Sunday), the *Chaplet*, the *Novena to The Divine Mercy*, and prayer at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, *the Hour of Great Mercy*.

Although these means of receiving God's mercy are new in form, they all proclaim the timeless message of God's merciful love. They also draw us back to the great Sacrament of Mercy, the Holy Eucharist, where the living Lord, who suffered and died on the Cross and whose Heart was pierced with a lance, pours forth His mercy on all mankind, and grants pardon to all who draw near and honor Him. As Jesus told St. Faustina: **My Heart overflows with great mercy for souls, and especially for poor sinners...[I]t is for them that the Blood and Water flowed from My Heart as from a fount overflowing with mercy. For them I dwell in the tabernacle as King of Mercy.** (*Diary*, 367)

IMAGE OF DIVINE MERCY

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her: Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory (*Diary*, 47, 48). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You (327). I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world (47).

What do the rays in the image represent? The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (299). By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works (742).

These words indicate that the Image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Bap-

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

A novena is typically nine days of prayer. The Chaplet can be said anytime, but the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a noyone. He promised "Put this Novena (of Chaplete) Lyvill of



vena. He promised, "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls."

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 15 and concludes on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24. Join us at 3:00pm in Gethsemane Chapel for the Divine Mercy Devotions. 


