



Bring a Friend



As we move into this new year, with new challenges and opportunities both for our nation, and for our parishes, let us be sure to ask God for His blessings always. On a more personal level, I wish to ask for prayers for Fr. Bill and for me, as well as for all priests. Pray that we will be able to serve you with joy and with great love at all times. Pray that we will all be endowed with an abundance of all the virtues.

The responsibility to preach the gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ is the primary responsibility of priests and deacons. It is in fact the primary responsibility of the clergy, even ahead of governing and sanctifying God's people. That said, priests are quite human, and will occasionally misspeak, or speak without the utmost thoroughness or clarity. At the 4 pm Mass this past Saturday at St. Monica's, I transgressed in this way. I realized my mistake quickly, and I modified my homily for the Sunday Masses I celebrated, but I would like to be able to clarify what was said in my homily on Saturday.

Without going into all of what was said, I mentioned something that Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger wrote in a book published in 1986, concerning the possibility of someone fasting from receiving Holy Communion, in order to be in solidarity with those who are unable to receive, particularly due to matters related to second marriages after divorce. I think that I may have given the impression that I was suggesting that people should undertake this discipline immediately. That was not my intention, and I am very sorry for the confusion.

Any person who is, to the best of their knowledge, in a state of sanctifying grace, should always feel free to receive Holy Communion. In 1905, Pope St. Pius X encouraged frequent, and even daily reception. One may even receive a

second time in a single day, as long as they are at mass when they receive the second time. Frequent reception of communion demands of us frequent confession. If we receive every Sunday, then it would be reasonable to try very hard to get to confession every month or two, at the very least.

Nevertheless, no one who is well disposed for reception of communion should ever hesitate to receive. However, since we are only required to receive once per year (we must come to Mass every Sunday and Holy Day), it is possible to refrain from receiving, if we have discerned well the reason for doing so. This should only be done after prayerful discernment, with spiritual counsel.

It is very important to me that I be exact in my preaching, and it is equally important that you feel comfortable approaching me if you have any question at all regarding anything I preach about, or say publicly.



"He called them. and immediately thev left their boat and their father and followed him." Peter, Andrew, James, and John's lives would never be the same. They were going about their usual business-fishing on the Sea of Galilee--

when Jesus approached them and said, "Come after me." And that's just what they did. "At once they left their nets and followed him." Such a quick response to such a radical request!

What compelled these men to leave their livelihood to follow the Lord? His promise to them was that he would make them "fishers of men." Perhaps they thought that promise sounded fabulous. But it seems more likely that it was Christ himself who drew the men. There must have been something utterly attractive about him, and completely trustworthy. Otherwise, it seems unbelievable that these men would have been so quick to respond to his call.

This compelling man is the same Christ who calls us. We hear his voice in a different way, of course, through the Church and through the Bible, through his Spirit in our hearts, but it is nonetheless the same Jesus of Nazareth who asks us to follow him. Have we allowed ourselves to be drawn by his voice? Are we open to a real encounter with the Lord who changes lives?

If our relationship with Jesus does not transform us, if it does not change us into different, better people moment by moment and day by day, then chances are that we are not truly encountering him. He is too powerful to be inconsequential. It might take some courage and commitment to come into authentic contact with the Lord, but when we do, our lives will never be the same.
