

#### **Blessed Virgin Mary Sodality News**

We begin our Lenten Suppers (pizza or soup) in the Church hall on Friday evening March 3<sup>rd</sup> immediately following the Stations of the Cross at 5:30 pm.

Our first evening will be soup. Please join us every week during the weeks of Lent.

Our next Sodality meeting is Sunday, March  $19^{th}$ , after the 9:30 Mass and the praying of the Rosary.

We are a Sodality dedicated to the Blessed Mother in service to our parish and our community. It is my great privilege to be able to interact with people who are much wiser and holier than I am, and I'm able to do so on a daily basis. A few weeks ago, I was having a conversation with two such persons that turned to whether or not a child can ever be guilty of stealing from his or her parent. The answer may seem to be obvious, but I answered that it is generally not stealing for a child to take something from their parent. I think that an explanation of this could be enlightening.

One of the foundational principles of Catholic social teaching is called the Universal Destination of Goods. Very simply, this principle states that God ultimately owns everything, and that what he created is meant for every one of us. God has created enough food, clothing, and shelter for each and every human being. The acquisition of private property is permitted because human nature is such that people take more care to acquire things that are their own, than things that will be held in common. This is why socialism generally is disastrous, with only a few exceptions.

While acquiring one's own property is a good thing, one must always remember the words of St. Paul when he says that if one acquires something, he should behave as though "he were not the owner (1 Cor. 7:30)." One who owns property is a "steward of Providence (CCC 2404)," who has the duty to use his property for the service of all. Within a family, all of the property that is held is for the benefit of all, and so, properly speaking, a young child cannot steal from his parents. I would not want anyone to say that Fr. Cassani condones this in any way. A child should only use family property according to the will of his parents. Not to do so may well constitute a violation of the 4th Commandment, which would potentially be more serious than violating the 7th.

As we near the start of Lent, it may be good to ask ourselves how we can be better

stewards of the gifts of Divine Providence, especially as it pertains to our prayer, fasting, and alms giving. Let's also pray for all who dedicate themselves to the service of the poor, and for the safe travels of those who are traveling abroad in service of Christ and His poor.

#### Lenten Disciplines of Fasting & Abstinence

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
